BADGE

You are assigned a personal badge, which is required for entering the buildings, accessing labs and keys, garages, laser printers.

How to activate the badge:

You have completed the form, and your badge will now be delivered to you.

The badge shall be returned the day you discuss your thesis.

For specific laboratories, please contact the Department Management Office, as those accesses will need to be activated separately later on according to your needs.



OFFICE

Your working desk will be assigned to each of you by the Department of your supervisor (either DPG or DPSS). Both departments are aware and prepared to offer you a working station.

For most of you your permanent office shall be located in the CLA building (this building), where you will carry out your regular work activities.

Should you need a desk in the Computer Room (room 036 in Psycho 1 bulding – ground floor), this has 18 working positions (with PC) which are primarily available for temporary use — PRE-BOOKING IS REQUIRED via https://vlabbooking.vdi.ict.unipd.it




TIPS & ADVISE

What the university expect from you:


- Take the responsibility of your project
- Work hard
- Multitask (don't exaggerate though)
- Develop new skills (data collection, analysis, writing)
- Be prepared to spread your research



PhD student (center) looking at his project while his supervisor (right) watches over him




- Take time to define your PhD project
- Be realistic about your objectives and the time at your disposal
- Plan your work in advance but be flexible
- Listen to feedbacks and be ready to compromise
- Take your time to learn skills you don't have yet (Psicostat is here for you)
- Side-projects can be a growing experience






- Nurture a good relationship with your supervisor and your research group
- Explicitate your expectations to your supervisor and ask them to do the same with you
- If someone asks you to do something and you are not able to, don't be afraid to say it. You are here to learn!
- Find other people in the faculty that can support your research





- Everyone can experience the impostor syndrome: if you're here you deserve it!
- Don't compare yourself with others (everyone has their own journey), but find inspiration from them
- You're gonna make mistakes, don't be afraid of them
- Be patient with yourself: it's okay to not have the same motivation every day.





- The PhD life is very flexible, enjoy it and experience many things...
- …like traveling thanks to the research budget
- There are many amazing positive and supportive people, go find them and keep them close!
- Take a break every once in a while, it's better to take a day off than to overstress and work badly

SUPERVISOR (tutor assigning procedure)

The supervisor is FORMALLY assigned by *Collegio dei Docenti* (General Board of the Professors of the PhD course) within December 31st 2025

Whenever possible, the assignment procedure takes into account reciprocal expectancies (PhD students and Board)

Grants on Dedicated or pre-assigned project (e.g., DPG, DPSS, MSCA COFUND, PNRR, etc.) and grants related to specific agreements with other Institutions (e.g., CSC) follow different assignment rules



CO-SUPERVISOR

- It is mandatory for each PhD student to select a Cosupervisor (ASAP and possibly within 31 March 2026)
- The co-supervisor can have different roles depending on the project specificities:
 - Research collaboration and research support
 - Mentorship, external support
 - Referent or supervisor for a separate research
- The co-supervisor shall be approved by the supervisor



CLASSES

During your PhD you are required to attend a minimum of 145 hours of courses in total, distributed as follows:

- 1st year: at least 100 hours of classes
 - 65 hours of mandatory courses
 - 35 hours of elective courses (chosen according to your research interests)
- 2nd year: 25 hours of mandatory courses
- 3rd year: 20 hours of mandatory courses

You are strongly recommended to complete all 1st-year courses within your first year.

There are also several optional courses, including:

Methodology and statistics Practical skills

Mini-courses Programming







The Role of the PhD Academic Mediator

Purpose

To promote the *amicable resolution* of conflicts between PhD candidates and their supervisors at the University of Padua.

To support a *healthy and constructive* student–supervisor relationship.

How Mediation Works

Activated <u>upon request</u> by either party (student or supervisor).

Entirely voluntary and confidential.

Both parties must consent to participate and may withdraw at any time.

Mediator's Function

Acts as a *neutral facilitator* helping the parties identify and develop options for resolving their conflict.

Provides information, guidance, and assistance — but has no decision-making or sanctioning power.

May alert the *PhD Program Coordinator* to **systemic** issues to prevent future conflicts.



Core Principles

Impartiality & Independence: No conflict of interest; acts autonomously and reports only to the Vice-Rector.

Confidentiality:

Mediation sessions are private and undocumented.


No information is shared without consent.

Exception: risk of serious harm or legal violations.

Privacy Compliance: All data handled according to EU GDPR (Reg. 2016/679) and Italian privacy law.






